



Erin Byrd is the Civic Engagement Coordinator at Blueprint North Carolina. She leads the organization's work to build capacity of nonprofits to do voter and civic engagement work. Prior to joining Blueprint in February 2007, Erin served as the Executive Director of Southerners for Economic Justice (2004-07), where she developed a statewide People of Color Coalition and led youth civic engagement projects. She also served as the Director of NC Voters for Clean Elections (2000-04), which passed the first judicial public financing legislation in the United States; worked as the coordinator for NC's the Same Day Voter Registration Coalition; and was the treasurer of the NC Black Leadership Caucus.
